Cumberwell opened in the Autumn of 1994 and has gone on to welcome many junior members, and at present we have 70 who enjoy full use of the course.

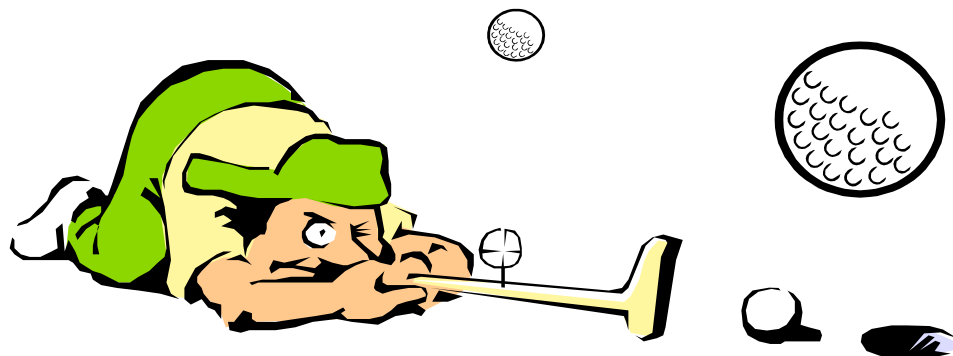

We hope you find the information in this brochure useful and if you aren't already a member with us, we hope you feel that Cumberwell would be a great place to join.

Parents have a role to undertake within their child's membership/ participation in golf at Cumberwell Park.

PGA Professionals, coaches, staff and volunteers will endeavour to develop strong trusting relationships with their golfers. However, to assist the club, parents should :

- **Take an interest in their children's activity and progress and be supportive**
- **Introduce themselves to the adults involved in the supervision of the junior section, spend some time talking to the Junior Organizer, PGA Professional's, Mentors and Child Welfare Officer**
- **Find out what the club has to offer; what is the package? When are coaching sessions and junior competitions; are there any playing restrictions for children who are beginners?**
- **Obtain any good practice guidance for children from the club and go through it with your child**
- **Know whether there are any age restrictions regarding children playing on their own on the course**
- **Be punctual when dropping off and picking up your children for/from coaching and competitions**
- **Take an interest in who your son/daughter is playing with, introduce yourself if it is an adult you do not know**
- **If leaving your son/daughter at the club please make sure they have some spending money, appropriate clothing (i.e. a hat to protect them from the sun or waterproofs in the winter), a drink to take in their bag; dehydration occurs even if it is not that warm**
- **Have clear lines of communication to keep up with your child's progress**
- **Ensure that the club has an emergency contact number for you when you are away from the club, a mobile would be preferable, and that you leave your mobile switched on so that you can be contacted in an emergency**
- **Advise the Junior Organizer/Club Welfare Officer if your child has any particular needs (e.g. allergies, learning disabilities) to ensure they are provided for in the best way possible**



Rules & Etiquette

Here are a few easy-to-follow guidelines on how to behave on and around the golf course.

- Maintain a good standard of dress on and off the golf course.
- Good behaviour and fair play at all times.
- Before swinging your club make sure there is no one behind that you are likely to hit.
- If your ball might hit someone in front, warn them by shouting 'FORE'
- Stand still and remain quiet while your fellow player is playing.
- Don't delay as you will slow down other players.
- Replace any divots and repair any pitch marks.
- Keep trolleys off putting greens.
- Don't lose your temper.
- The basis of the game is honesty, don't be tempted to cheat.

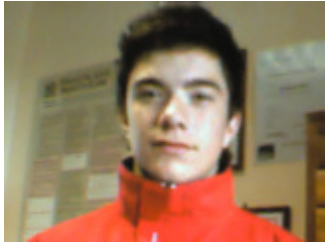


Cumberwell's Aim for Junior Golfers

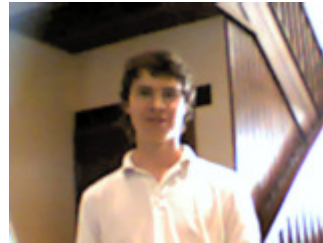
